# CONCLUSION

The overall observations of the academic audit committee based on input collected from all departments are

- Course delivery is conducted as per the curricula of the university.
- Department meetings are regularly conducted.
- Classes are conducted as per the timetable and records are maintained.
- Internal evaluation is fair and transparent.
- Faculty members actively participate in the administrative process.
- Departments conduct seminars and workshops.
- The pass percentage is high compared to university average for many of the programmes.
- Student placement is at mediocre level only.
- Laboratory facilities are sufficient.
- Many of the departments offering only UG programme have good infrastructure adequate for starting of PG courses.
- New equipment and books are purchased.
- The extension activities of the college help to develop socially responsible citizens.
- Students actively participate in college level programmes.
- The dropout rate of students is low.

The committee recommends the following suggestions for the improvement of the academic performance of the college.

- Smart rooms may be more effectively utilized by employing specialized software.
  - Coaching programmes may be effectively conducted for NET/SET/ etc.
  - A course diary may be maintained for each course.

- Faculty members may take up more research projects.
- Faculty members may publish more research papers in peer reviewed journals.
- Faculty members with Ph D may take up research guideship and research centers may be established with the approval of the university.
  - More PG programmes may be started.

It is hoped that the academic audit will help the college in its quality enhancement process and in developing the future plans of the college.
